A visit to UPSS by Wailing Women Ghana

GTA Visit to UPSS

The Global Transformation Agenda (GTA) of Wailing Women Ghana, in partnership with CRAN, visited University Practice Senior High School (UPSS), where Mrs. Josephine Asmah, Assistant Headmistress and a Wailing Woman, warmly welcomed the students alongside the House Mistress. Mrs. Patricia Aboagye delivered a keynote address on "Purity for God," emphasizing the importance of prioritizing God in all aspects of life to avoid sin. She encouraged students to embody holiness, adhere to God's teachings, and maintain daily Bible reading and prayer habits, referencing Psalm 1:1-3. Mama Patricia also warned against negative influences, harmful friendships, and detrimental social media activities.



Mrs. Aboagye advised the young women to remain steadfast in their commitment to God and focus on their education, preparing themselves for a successful future. She cautioned against societal pressures and distractions that could lead to unethical behavior, emphasizing that virtuous and pure individuals are often sought after as partners.
