CRAN Facilitates Participation in the 2026 Leadership Summit

More than 30 African countries participated in the Leadership Summit held in Accra, Ghana, at the La Palm Beach Resort, and CRAN was pleased to sponsor some participants. Organized by Wailing Women Worldwide, the summit took place from February 4 to 7, 2026, and focused on transformative leadership. The theme for this year’s summit was “Team Building,” inspired by Nehemiah 4:6–14. The event began with a welcome address by Mrs. Gifty A. E. Saah, the Central Regional Coordinator of Wailing Women Ghana. In her remarks, she thanked God for the safe arrival of participants and prayed for those still traveling. The praise and worship team then led participants into a moment of worship, drawing everyone into God’s presence. Prof. Vincent Anigbogu delivered the first message on the theme **“Team Building.”** He emphasized the importance of collaboration and unity in achieving meaningful transformation. He explained that when God created humanity, He said, “Let us make man in our own image,” demonstrating the principle of divine collaboration. Even within the Godhead, there is unity and purposeful partnership. He further noted that if Africa is to experience true transformation, the power of teamwork must be embraced. No great vision can be accomplished alone. Jesus Himself did not work in isolation; He called disciples—including fishermen and a tax collector—to assist Him in fulfilling His mission. In essence, purpose requires partnership.

Transformation

Prof. Anigbogu further linked transformation to responsibility and used Habakkuk 2:1: the prophet declares, “I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts; I will look to see what He will say to me.” Instead of complaining about his circumstances, Habakkuk chose to reposition himself. He decided to stand in a place of spiritual alertness and prayer, waiting for God’s instruction and correction. In the same way, we must move from complaint to commitment and from frustration to intercession. True transformation begins when we take our stand in prayer and embrace our spiritual responsibility.



Team Building: Strategic Leader

Dr. Salomon Appiah delivered an insightful message on the theme “Strategic Building,” drawing inspiration from Isaiah 11:2 and Isaiah 9:6. He explained that the Spirit of the Lord that rested upon Jesus endowed Him with the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, as well as the Spirit of counsel and might. This divine empowerment enabled Jesus to perform miracles and wonders and provided Him with the strategic insight needed to operate effectively in different aspects of His ministry.

In describing the role of a strategic leader, Dr. Appiah identified several key attributes essential for effective leadership:

- **Advocacy:** A strategic leader must serve as an advocate both spiritually and practically, championing the mission, vision, and well-being of the community they lead.
- **Counsel:** Strategic leaders should provide sound, informed, and insightful advice that promotes wise decision-making and organizational growth.
- **Guidance:** A strategic leader must offer clear direction, helping others navigate challenges, seize opportunities, and achieve their goals.

Dr. Appiah concluded that by embodying these qualities, leaders are better positioned to guide their organizations and communities toward the fulfillment of their vision and purpose.
